



WKO World Grand Prix

The WKO World Grand Prix are formed from results of competitors who have entered WKO Open Championships.

WKO World Grand Prix Ranking Events from the annual season from:

- WKO English Open
- WKO British Open
- WKO 5 Nations Open
- WKO European Open
- WKO K-1 World Championships
- WKO Open World Championships

WKO World Grand Prix Ranking Points Are:

- Gold Medallist 4 Points
- Silver Medallist 3 Points
- Bronze Medallist 2 Point
- Entering Each Tournament 1 Point

The fighter with the most points of the weight division will be listed as Number 1.

However with so many Age/Weight divisions there would be far too many lists to compile. We appreciate this is unfair to all the individual age groups to only recognise the weight group. So we have 1 weight group for all ages as the season progresses.

Then once the season has finished all the fighters who are No1 of their Actual Age/Weight & Gender are all joint No1 (although the table wont show that).

If you are top of your Age & Weight Division within that rule set, then you are eligible to order the WKO Grand Prix, Grand Champion Belt if desire to do so. (these are of course optional)

All points are added up, most amount of points at the end of the season then:

Number One Rank of the Grand Prix and WKO Grand Prix, Grand Champion of their respective group culminating of:

- Rules
- Gender
- Weight
- Age

Weight Groups:

-25k, -30k, -35k, -40k, -45k, -50k, -55k, -60k, -65k, -70k, -75k, -80k, -85k, -90k, -95k, +95k

Age Groups:

Under 5yrs, 6-7yrs, 8-9yrs, 10-11yrs, 12-13yrs, 14-15yrs, 16-17yrs, 18yrs+, 35yrs+, 45yrs+

WKO Grand Prix is compiled from **Open Championships** both National and International events. With thousands of competitors who are competing in both Ring & Tatami Sports.

This makes all WKO Open Champions AAA events Achievement, Acknowledgement and be Awarded.

These World Grand Prix results will be updated following every WKO Open Championships, then at the end of the year the Number one is the Grand Prix winner for that year.

Congratulations to all ranked fighters this is an achievement within itself and a testament to yourself, your club and your coach.
